Step 1 Do your research.

Look for inspiration on social media, ask friends about their last great vacation, and browse through travel books. Consider your budget, travel companions, goals, and comfort level.

Don't forget to check the State Department's up-to-date <u>Travel Advisory</u> and Alerts.

Step 2 Learn the visa requirements.

Some countries require a visa issued by their embassy. Find <u>visa</u> <u>requirements</u> and embassy contacts for your destination through the State Department.

Step 3 Check your passport.

Your passport should be valid for at least six months after you return home and have at least two consecutive blank pages. If you need to renew yours, plan ahead. The process can take several months.

Keep track of multiple passports for each family member in Trustworthy, including expiration date reminders and country-specific renewal instructions for select countries.

Step 4 Make a reservation.

Plan months in advance to find the best travel deals.

Step 5 Get required immunizations.

Check the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> to learn which shots are required for your destination. Make an appointment with your primary care doctor at least one month before you travel.

- Documentation for medication
- International Driving Permit (IDP)
- Supplemental auto insurance (if needed)

Step 8

Choose travel insurance.

Notify credit card companies.
